

2025 Year 12 Diploma Criteria

To gain a Lincoln High School Year 12 Diploma, a student needs to meet all of the following criteria:

1. Complete NCEA Literacy and Numeracy.
2. Obtain an overall average attendance rate of 97% or more, for all 2025 timetabled periods including the Linc periods.
3. Obtain a minimum of 70% of all internal NCEA credits that are assessed in 2025.

Notes:

- a) If a student gains a Year 11 and Year 12 diploma, they are eligible to gain a Graduation diploma with distinction in Year 13.
- b) Due to exceptional circumstances, a student who has not met all of the criteria may be eligible for Principal discretionary consideration.
- c) The attendance rate is based on the periods attended or that have justified absences (e.g. medical absences or appointments, school events and trips, exam leave, etc). Absences that reduce the diploma attendance rate include unexplained absences, truancy, holidays during term time, and unjustified absences in accordance with the Ministry of Education requirements.
- d) In instances where a period of absence for 10 days or less may affect a student's ability to receive their diploma, and this absence is for family reasons, the student's Tutor and Head of Level may apply discretionary consideration, provided the student has demonstrated a satisfactory attempt to catch up on learning missed during this time.
- e) The Year 12 Awards ceremony takes place in February 2026.
- f) Involvement in an ongoing or significant behavioural issue may result in a student not being invited to the Year 12 Awards ceremony.
